During the third week of August of each year, about 65 children ages 8 to 18 that have been hospitalized at The Children's Hospital Burn Center and other burn centers across the country attend the Cheley/Children's Hospital Burn Camp

Whether they are on a challenge course, catching their first (or hundredth) fish, technical climbing Christmas Tree rock, mountain biking riding a horse or creating crafts in the crafts shop, the children who attend Cheley/Children's Hospital Burn Camp gain more than a fun summer week.They gain confidence. They gain life skills. They gain great memories. And most of all, they gain the friendship of others who can truly understand. The Children's Hospital burn camp staff consists of nurses, occupational therapists, physical therapists and psychological care providers. These represent the staff members that are responsible for the medical care and rehabilitative aspects of camp, while the Cheley staff is responsible for program and carrying the Cheley philosophy and spirit into this special week. Firefighters, staff from outlying burn centers and adult burn survivors fill in the gaps to provide their own level of expertise, which includes anything from professional burn care to fire safety.

We have made it a goal for no child to be turned away because of financial reasons. This has become possible with the generosity of many people. Thank you to those who have sent in personal checks and to Tahara Lodge for their dedication to the art show, to the Estes Park Firefighters for organizing the golf tournament, the Cherry Creek Rotary Club and Old Chicago's in Greeley, CO.
