
Dear Campers,

A partial list of equipment needs for boys as listed in the **1935 catalog**:

Woolen socks or stockings
Two suits pajamas
Woolen or corduroy riding breeches.
Outing shoes, stout but not too heavy.
One-piece woolen bathing suit.
Light soft shirts for Sunday.
Suit bag for storing travel clothes during summer, shirr string top.

A partial list of equipment needs for girls as listed in the **1935 catalog**:

Colored outing shorts.

Whipcord gray or green riding breeches. Two ties.

One bathing suit, all wool (California style). One kimona.

Plenty of all-wool golf hose.

One four-gallon hat for riding, hiking.
Blue jeans are not allowed for girls for many reasons. White ducks may be substituted.

Two stout laundry bags with shirr strings.

By now you should have received several forms. Following is an explanation of how the forms are used and where they go on our property. Please make sure all forms are completely filled out and returned as soon as possible.

Cream four-page Cheley Application and Liability Waiver – this form gets your camper enrolled, includes your contact information and allows your camper to participate in all activities. This form stays on file in the office.

Green four-page Medical and Health Information – this form is vital to the health and well being of your camper. It gets copied and stays on file in the office in case of emergencies, and the original goes to the appropriate Health Center to be viewed and used by the Registered Nurses.

Blue double-sided Camper/Parent Information Form – this form helps our new and returning staff get to know your camper before they arrive. Please attach a picture as it helps us identify them on opening day. This form is kept with the Director and unit staff.

Green Travel Form – This is kept on file in the office after being entered into

our computer system. It is important to let us know about any changes to your camper's travel. It is also important to get this form to us as soon as possible so we can organize our staff for Opening and Closing Days.

Yellow double-sided Store Form – This form allows you to budget with your camper what they can spend in our camp store. Please remember your store "limit" does not include extras like boots, airport fees, yearbooks and other extras. It is only for purchases in our store and daily treats. This gets entered in the computer and then stays in the office.

Pink Emergency Contact Card – This is our link with you if we ever had an emergency. This card stays on file in the office where it is easily accessible.

Whew! That's a lot! Thank you for your help in getting all of these papers completed and in our hands. Having them early makes for a smooth transition into the camp season and halts any delays in letting your camper participate in our great programs and activities. Please get in touch with us if you have any questions about the paperwork.
