WHAT ARE YOU MANIFESTING IN YOUR LIFE?

I received an email from the woman who is directing Leaders for Life at Cheley, Teresa Huggins, talking about a new strategy she has been using recently. She read a book called "Manifesting for Non-Gurus" by Robert MacPhee. Teresa says she spends a few minutes each morning answering the following questions. She then takes action during the day with increased awareness. The questions are:

- 1. *Who am I*? Be clear on what your purpose is and follow things that support that purpose. You then live with this in mind.
- 2. What am l intending to create? Visualize the outcome you want. It is fine if you have no idea how it will be created.
- 3. *How will I feel?* Connect with the feeling within you when your vision is achieved. It is like backward planning. If I did achieve my goal or my vision, what would it feel like?
- 4. **Detach from the results (letting go).** This is the hard part. The mind wants to hold on and figure out how to accomplish everything and even starts doubting that it is possible.
- 5. *Take inspired action.* Listen to your thoughts and take action on ideas that come to you.

For example, if you have a goal of completing a marathon, these will be great questions to help you accomplish your goal. Each morning, you can associate with being a marathon runner. Visualize your goal time. Visualize yourself running comfortably for the entire duration with relaxed muscles. Spend a few minutes thinking about these questions and then release the outcome from your thoughts. Now get out of bed and put your running shoes on. During the day, you will be faced with decisions and this process will make these decisions easy. For example, what and when you are going to eat, when you are going to sleep, the people you will associate with, etc.

With continued practice, living with these questions and answers in mind throughout the day will influence your actions to create positive results. Start small with easier goals and as you improve, take on bigger goals in your life. You can use this with work, school, relationships, or any other area in your life. I look forward to hearing your success stories.
