I watched a wonderful video of an interview with author Seth Godin, author of *Linchpins - Are you Indispensable?* During the interview he talked about the beauty of summer camp. Seth states, "I learned so much at camp about what our world needs from us. When camps are at their best, they create linchpins" (people who are an essential element to the success of a team or a plan).

"Camps are not about top-down authority; they are not about doing what someone did yesterday but a little faster; they are not about doing well on the standardized test. Camps are about becoming that person – the someone who would be missed if they were gone."

He went on to talk about the idea that the only person you are competing with is yourself. "If you are competing with yourself, then why is mediocrity acceptable? A great summer camp makes it so you don't accept the status quo."

At Cheley, we strive to challenge young people to be the best they can be. Last summer, our leadership staff had some great conversations about meeting people where they are in their own journey and strategies on how to help them move forward. We are all at different points in our development as human beings. As long as we are consistently striving to improve, we will continue in our development.

Recently I have been taking golf lessons, and I consistently get frustrated with the process. I feel like many times it is two steps forward and one step backwards. I am then reminded that even the best players in the world are constantly working to improve their game. The same is true about life. Many successful people are still taking classes, reading books and working with coaches to improve as athletes, performers, artists, and leaders.

What are you doing on a daily basis to be a better person? Are you becoming a linchpin in your family, your team, and your organization?


MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR 2012



Each year, they have succeeded in growing their mission, "To secure the benefits of a summer mountain camp experience for children whose family resources are not adequate to cover the costs." Each summer, we witness the benefits of a summer camp experience, and we hear about the lasting benefits throughout the year from current campers and campers from long ago.



This past summer, we made a commitment to our staff that we would match every dollar they donated. Each Cheley Family Member (Don & Carole Cheley, Jeff & Erika Cheley, Kurt and Brooke Cheley Klebe), and Microsoft Corporation agreed to match the staff's donations. We also had a camp family agree to match the staff donations. The staff (most of them college students or recent graduates) donated over \$5,000 out of their summer paychecks. Donations ranged from \$10 to \$500. This netted a total donation to the Cheley Foundation of over \$30,000. That means six more campers will enjoy the benefits of a camp experience this summer. Burn Camp Creates Fundraising Campaign

Since 1983 the Cheley community has partnered with The Children's Hospital Burn Camps Program. Our unique relationship with this incredible program has developed into an inspirational organization that facilitates the physical and emotional growth of children who have suffered a burn injury and their families.

This year we are proud to announce the Faithful 500

Friends for Burn Camp as a method to build a base of annual giving. This campaign will enlist 500 Friends from the Burn Camp and



Cheley communities to raise or donate a minimum of \$100 annually for 5 years. The funds raised will be used to cover transportation costs, camp scholarships, and academic scholarships for young burn survivors and to establish an endowment for the Burn Camps program.

The Cheley / Children's Burn Camp Program began with 25 campers and grew to 85 campers this past summer. The Burn Camps program has grown into continuum of camp experiences offered throughout the course of a young person's life designed to guide kids beyond their scars and into living life to its fullest potential. The program also includes young adult retreats, family camps, international exchange programs, and a winter ski camp.

Suit bag for storing travel clothes during summer, shirr string top.

A partial list of equipment needs for girls as listed in the 1935 catalog:

Colored outing shorts.

Whipcord gray or green riding breeches.

Two ties.

One bathing suit, all wool (California style).

One kimona.

Plenty of all-wool golf hose.

One four-gallon hat for riding, hiking.

Blue jeans are not allowed for girls for many reasons. White ducks may be substituted.

Two stout laundry bags with shirr strings.
